We start this update with a warm welcome to Colin Millington as the new Director of Music at Holy Trinity. We are very much looking forward to working with Colin going forward and are already delighted to share in his enthusiasm for all things musical at Holy Trinity and his plans for the choir.

Looking Back

Our last Newsletter was circulated in April, since when it has been a busy Summer for the Friends of the Music.

Annual General Meeting

Held on 22 June and chaired by the Vicar, the meeting enabled us to report on our activities over the past year and elect the committee for the coming year. The meeting also included the opportunity to recognise the achievements of our young choristers with the distribution of awards and prizes. The meeting was followed by talented performances from a number of the choristers.

Concerts

In addition to our weekly lunchtime Soundbites series, which has continued to attract audiences averaging 100 attendees, the Friends have hosted two very successful evening events. On Sunday 27 April, we re-instated the 'Shakespeare Organ Recital' with Martin Baker giving a remarkable recital. The event also celebrated the re-commissioning of the refurbished organ.

On Saturday 7 June, the Oxford based choir LUCEAT, directed by James Fellows, presented a musical and liturgical reconstruction of the Coronation of Elizabeth I (*Gloriana*). The evening began with the Warwick Minstrels, a group of young musicians playing music of the period. The church was then used to glorious effect as LUCEAT as brought the Coronation to life.

Royal School of Church Music, Residential Summer School

Building on the precedent of the past two years, the Friends were again pleased to provide bursaries for four choristers to attend this week long course which took place in Bath in August. The following comment from Bethany, one of the choristers who we supported, sums up the value of the week:

"It was a week of learning, friendship, and lots of singing with our week culminating with two beautiful services at Bath Abbey. I have always found the Bath course to be an invaluable way to build confidence in my singing and site reading, making me a better singer.
